MONDAY, MAY 4, 2020 - Teaching About Religion in the Classroom

Anti-religious sentiment is on the uptick in the United States and Europe. Education about and exposure to the world's religious traditions are critical for students as they become global citizens. This interactive segment explores the legal foundations in the United States for teaching about religion in schools, and uses case studies to consider the very real challenges involved in teaching this topic.



TUESDAY, MAY 5, 2020 - History of European Antisemitism: The Longest Hatred

Where does antisemitism come from? This is a question that students often ask when learning about the Holocaust, but since the events in Charlottesville (2017), Pittsburgh (2018), San Diego (2019), plus incidents in Germany and other European nations, the need for greater instruction on the topic is critical. This segment outlines the larger context of antisemitism and offers the content teachers need to help students understand the origins and history of the “longest hatred” for both the study of the Holocaust and events today.



WEDNESDAY, MAY 6, 2020 - Teaching the Arab-Israeli Conflict & Peace Process

Explore the history of the Arab-Israeli conflict and peace process through primary source documents and teaching strategies that support critical analysis of texts. Participants will develop content knowledge, experience student activities, and receive resources with detailed lesson plans including primary source documents, maps, and all necessary student materials.
