The number of choices is isled for each context. Do not mark the ballot for more choices than allowed. You do not have to vote in every race.




Absentee Ballots postmarked by November 4th and received by the Board of Elections no later than November 12th, and November 18th for federal/military ballots, will be cast and counted.




